At last, some warm weather. I went from not having to mow my lawn to mowing it every week. The plants are taking off and flowers are beginning to bloom. I think spring is finally here, all we need now is some rain. The majority of yards in Mountain View look great. Keep up the good work.

We have had some problems with the gates during March. The JFK outbound gate was not working one Saturday morning and the next week the Cactus outbound gate was not working. If you see something in the common areas not working call Prescott at 951-699-7656 or give a Board member a call. Prescott's office in Temecula is open from 8:00 or 8:30 am until 5:00 pm. If something happens after these hours call the above number and they will refer you to a 24 hour number for emergencies. Both times the gates were stuck I called the emergency number and the gate company was out within the hour.

We have plants on the golf course bank that were hit with the frost and freezing. Both our landscape company and the golf course superintendent advised us to wait at least one more month to see which ones will live. We do not want to spend money needlessly if the plants will come back. We do need to know if any sprinklers are broken so please call Prescott to report

them.

I have had several occasions where homeowners tell me about something that is not working. Their comment is it hasn't been working for a week, two weeks, etc. and when are we going to do something about it. Most of the time we don't even know about the problem. Please call Prescott if you see something not working or if you have a problem. If the problem is not fixed or acted upon within a reasonable amount of time, call a Board member. We can't react to your problem if we don't know about it.

We have had several community members pass away during the past month. I would like to thank the community for the caring shown the remaining spouse and family members during their time of need. Mountain View truly is "a great place to live."

For the month of March we read John O'Hurley's book on "life lessons I have learned from dogs" entitled ***IT'S OKAY TO MISS THE BED ON THE FIRST JUMP***. Some chapter headings are: "When a Dog Barks—Listen and, If You're Happy, Wag Your Tail."

Our other selection for March was also a quick read, with some remarkable photos of water crystals. ***THE HIDDEN MESSAGES IN WATER*** by Masaru Emoto is a *New York Times* Bestseller. The author has visual evidence of how our thoughts and words affect water crystals. This is truly an amazing book. I heartily recommend it.

We have selected Sidney Poitier's spiritual autobiography ***THE MEASURE OF A MAN*** for the month of April, and in May we return to a novel, after several selections of non-fiction. ***DAUGHTER OF FORTUNE*** by Isabel Allende takes place in Chile and California during the gold rush era. A historical novel, this book shows considerable research into the history of that time. It is a good read!

As a long-term goal, we are aiming for Victor Villasenor's ***RAIN OF GOLD*** in June. It is a lengthy book, so I recommend that you get started on it soon. This true story chronicles the lives of two ordinary, yet remarkable, Mexican-American families. The families leave Mexico as a result of the Mexican Revolution of 1910. As Mexican immigrants to the United States, the families subsist as best they can. The book is a remarkable collective memoir of a people and time. It has sex, romance, violence, bootlegging, the American Dream, and strong family devotion. What makes it of added interest to us, is that is the true history of two families who lived here during the early years of Santa Ana and Corona.

THE GARDENER'S CORNER

From the gardener's corner... The weather now through June is great for planting citrus, avocados and other tender trees.

Prune frost damaged wood as soon as the plant or tree has finally leafed out and you can see what wood is dead. Start feeding your roses to ready them for the long blooming season. Weekly or every other week until fall, prune the spent blossoms down to a five-part leaf to gently shape the plant. Water only in the mornings and early afternoons to lessen mildew and other diseases. If you have ornamental grasses, now is a good time to divide and transplant them. Continue watering and feeding a balanced fertilizer to spring flowering bulbs until their foliage starts to yellow. This will strengthen the bulbs for next years' growth. Continue pulling weeds before they form seed heads and you will have fewer problems later.

What's Cooking?

When I think of April, I think of spring. How did “spring forward” happen in March? Well, April is still spring to me. Invite friends over to welcome in this season with a Sunday brunch.

BAKED FRENCH TOAST STRATA

(Serves six)

4 English muffins cut into 1-inch cubes	1/4 tsp salt
3 large eggs	1 2/3 cups half and half or whole milk
1/2 cup sugar	2 TBS margarine, melted
1 tsp cinnamon	1/8 tsp nutmeg (freshly grated, if you have)
1 tsp vanilla	

Spray a deep-dish pie plate with non-stick cooking spray. Arrange muffins in a single layer in the dish. Mix together sugar and cinnamon. Beat together eggs with cinnamon and sugar. Stir in vanilla and salt and mix well. Add half and half or milk and margarine. Mix well. Pour evenly over muffins and press down on the muffins to moisten with the liquid. Sprinkle nutmeg over mixture. Cover and refrigerate overnight, if desired, or bake immediately.

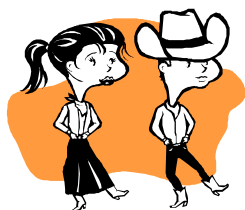
Bake in a 350° oven for 40 to 45 minutes or until puffed and golden brown. Transfer to a cooling rack and let cool for at least 10 minutes. Cut into 6 servings. Top with heated maple syrup and any of the toppings listed below.

Strawberry Topping—Combine 1¼ cups of thinly sliced strawberries, ¼ cup strawberry jam and 1 tsp orange juice in a microwave safe bowl. Cover and cook on high for 1 minute or until warm.

Peach and Blueberry Topping—Combine ¼ cup peach preserves and 1 TBS apple juice. Add 1 cup diced thawed frozen sliced peaches, and ¼ cup partially thawed blueberries. Mix together. Serve at room temperature or warmed in the microwave.

Blueberry Syrup—In a microwave-proof bowl, combine 1½ cups frozen blueberries and ½ cup sugar. Microwave on high for 1 minute. Stir and cook 1 to 2 minutes longer or until hot and bubbly.

Fresh fruit may always be used instead of frozen.

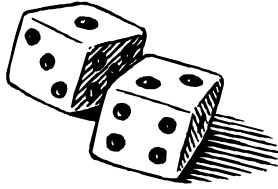
DINE OUT

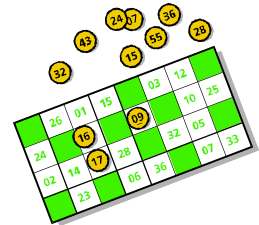
