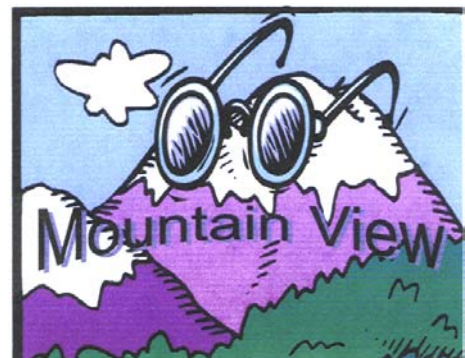
Wow! We quickly went from spring to summer. In my backyard, it has been over 100° for days in a row. If you want to keep your flowers from dying and yard green, now is the time to water and water and water. However, too much water will bring the dreaded fungus. I am learning that landscape issues in Mountain View are every bit a problem as elsewhere. We might not have snow, but we have four seasons—each with its own special issues.

We had two dead possums in the pool on Saturday, July 14th. The possums were removed and the pool was cleaned on Saturday morning. We had an excellent response from Prescott and our pool cleaning company.

Due to the pool incident, I have been informed that several homeowners are feeding the possums, raccoons, birds, etc. These are wild animals and should be discouraged from coming into our yards. These animals can be diseased, very destructive, attack pets, and generally become a nuisance. Please do not feed wild animals or encourage them into your yard. Leaving food out also encourages rats, mice, gophers, squirrels, rabbits and other pests. We also have coyotes along the golf course, so let's all do our part to keep unwanted animals in the golf course or the State Park.

The pool area is finally beginning to look nicer. We have completed the lighting project, the dead plants have been replaced, and a box has been installed around the entry gate to discourage usage without a key. The locks have been fixed in the clubhouse and all of the items stolen have been replaced. The complex generally looks good. If you have any complaints or see a problem, call our property manager or contact a board member. This is your community and we need to keep it looking nice. The property manager and/or the board cannot fix a problem we don't know about.

Let's all make Mountain View "a great place to live."

Summer is over and it's time to put the B-B-Q behind us and start dining out. Join us at the area's newest restaurant.

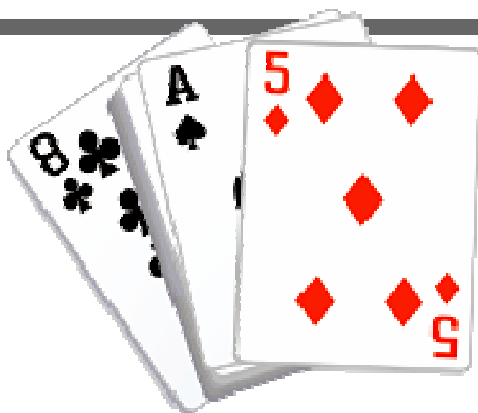
When: Thursday, September 20th

THE GARDENER'S CORNER

From the gardener's corner... Summer is here with bells on so during 100 degree days we'd best get out early in the morning or nothing will be accomplished. **Fruit trees:** remove tree suckers and water sprouts (the long shoots that spring up from the trunk base. If you have young fruit trees cool by painting them with white indoor latex paint. Pick up and destroy fallen fruit. Cut off any diseased or dead branches but don't do any heavy pruning until winter. Clean up around the base of each tree and add mulch. This will stop diseases from spreading. You can stop fertilizing this month.

Remove faded blooms of perennials and cut them back to within six inches of the soil and they may bloom again in the fall.

During the summer when your roses and various flowers are in the garden you want to bring them in to brighten up your home. I found a few tips helpful to make them last longer:

Try to pick blooms after sunset and put them in a bucket of warm water.

Have your vases ready with warm water to which you've added a drop of Clorox.

Take each bloom and strip off the foliage at the bottom so that no greenery will be below the water line.

Cut the bloom under running warm water in your sink and place in the vase. The Clorox will stop bacteria from forming.

Each day discard the water in the vase and add fresh water with a drop of Clorox. Nip off some of the stem of each flower under running warm water and replace in the vase.

Bet your flowers will last longer if you follow these tips. With all this heat we won't be digging in the dirt so sit back and enjoy yourselves.

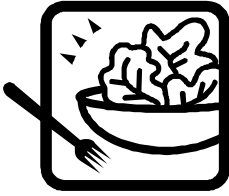

HERB AND WINE MARINATED STEAK (Serves two)

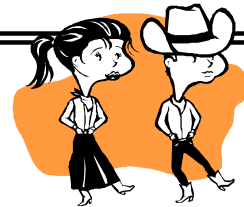
- 2 steaks (your choice) 1½ inch thick
- 2/3 cup red wine
- 1/3 cup red wine vinegar
- Juice of 1 lemon
- ¼ tsp tarragon
- ½ tsp garlic salt
- ½ tsp celery salt
- ½ tsp oregano
- 1 onion, chopped

Combine wine, vinegar and lemon juice and pour over the steaks. Sprinkle with salts, tarragon, oregano and onion. Marinate 1 to 2 hours at room temperature, turning occasionally. Grill steaks over medium fire for about 7 minutes on each side, or to desired doneness.

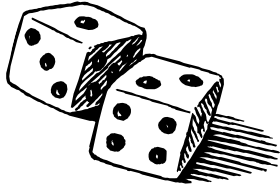

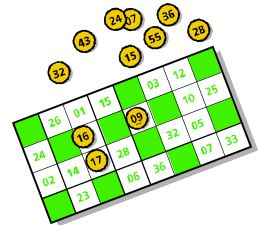

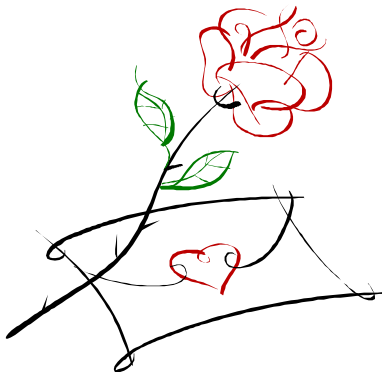
