If our property manager has not received your completed form by July 30th, you will receive a reminder, by mail, that you are required by law to complete this form. If you fail to do so you may be subject to fines. RECIPE EXCHANGE

GRILLED ASPARAGUS with Creamy Tangerine Dressing



Ingredients

- 2 pounds medium to small size <u>asparagus</u>, tough ends trimmed
- Extra-virgin olive oil for drizzling
- Salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 2 tangerines, zested and juiced
- A few small dashes hot <u>sauce</u> (or you can leave this out)
- 1/4 cup heavy <u>cream</u>

Purple onion ¹/₄ cup, sliced or diced (you can leave this out if you want)

Directions

Preheat indoor or outdoor grill to medium-high.

Pile asparagus onto a baking sheet and <u>drizzle</u> with some extra-virgin olive oil and season with some salt and pepper. Transfer to the <u>grill</u> and cook turning every now and then until the asparagus is well marked and is tender, about 5 minutes depending on the size of your asparagus.

While the asparagus is grilling--- Combine in a bowl the tangerine <u>zest</u> and juice with a little salt, pepper and a small <u>dash</u> of hot sauce. Add the heavy cream and <u>whisk</u> to <u>aerate</u> the cream. Remove the asparagus from the grill, serve hot, warm, or at room temperature with the sauce poured over it. Add the purple onions over top of sauce on asparagus (I like it **without** the onions, but it is a matter of taste and it adds color to the dish.)

Makes between 6-8 side dishes that will be great added to your meal.

*I have to admit that cream and tangerine sauce over asparagus did not sound good at first, but was delicious.



GARDENER'S CORNER

Protecting ourselves and our gardens from the heat is the mantra for August: **mulch, water and shade.**

There are a number of good commercially sold mulches to use. In this area, bark does a great job. It can be frustrating to deal with previous applications of bark that now look faded and dull. Freshen the look by retaining the old bark and putting a new layer on top. The faded bark will still do a good job of cooling the soil and retaining moisture; the new bark adds a fresh look.

Turf can be tough this time of year. In last year's August newsletter, there was a more detailed discussion of battling those stubborn brown spots. Below are a few of the points from that article. Some of the most common causes of brown spots:

Not enough moisture. Check your water application. Are the sprinklers putting out enough water in the right place? Is the soil absorbing and retaining the water? **Mower blades are dull.** If the brown spots appear within a day or two of mowing, the mower blades are suspect.

Fungus could be the culprit. If you eliminate water or mower problems, it could be fungus.

Over-feeding can result in brown spots. Keep watering and don't apply any more nutrients until the brown spots are gone.

Pet urine. Confine your pets to one area and live with the brown spots. Having pets has some consequences, but we love them. We count on our neighbors to curb their dogs when walking them. Try applying some gyp-sum to the brown spots and some extra water.

Are you uncertain about how often to water plants in containers? Check them daily and test the soil with your finger. If the soil is dry about one-inch deep, it is time to water. There are many variables that affect moisture retention in containers including: location, type of plant and the type of container.

Keep in mind that dark colored containers will absorb more heat than light colored containers. If you are having problems with container plants, try moving them to a different location. That is also a good rule of thumb for most plants,. If they aren't doing well try moving them to a different location.

If it is the first year that a plant has been in your garden, give it more TLC and some extra water.

Thinking ahead. If you are planning to order new bulbs for fall planting, start thinking about it now.
