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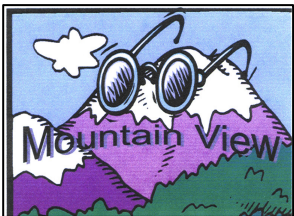

The Pool and Spa will be heated to temperature by March 1st.

Our Pool and Spa Maintenance Company has been performing all of the maintenance required to keep the pool and spa up to standard. This has consisted of draining the pool and spa, annual heater maintenance; pool and spa preventative maintenance includes draining and acid wash to remove staining; repairing the spa circulation and booster equipment. All maintenance will be completed on or before February 15th. At that time we can begin heating the pool for March 1st.

The spa temperature has been re-set and will remain at 102-104 degrees.

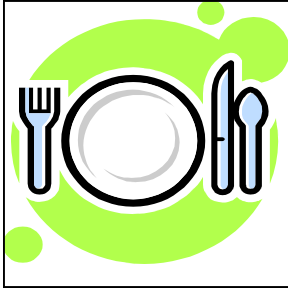
March is the yearly collection for Ronald McDonald House sponsored by the University of Redlands.

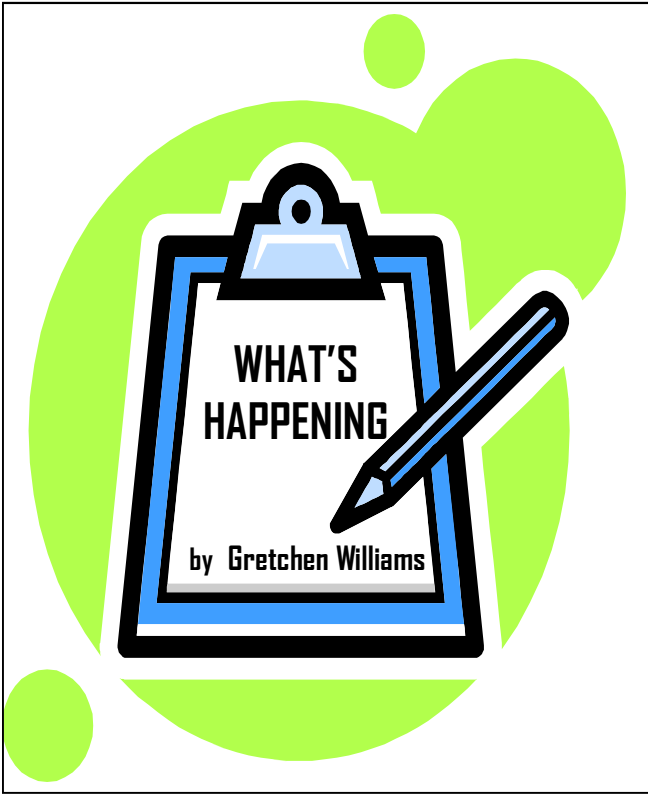

LADIES VALENTINE LUNCHEON

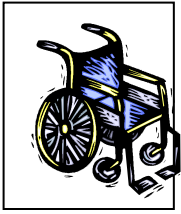
The Ladies Luncheon will be on Friday, February 12th, at 12 pm. It will be held at the Soboba Country Club on Soboba Road, in San Jacinto.

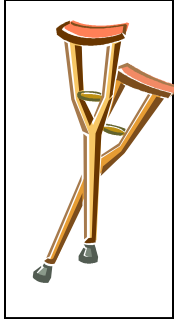

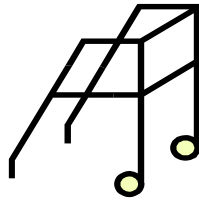

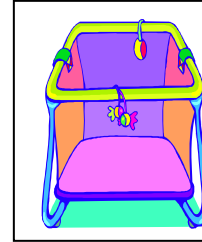

What's Cooking

We all have enjoyed Judy's bread pudding at TGIF, so with the chilly days and cold nights here, a warm bread pudding with piles of whipped cream sure sounds yummy

Bread Pudding

4 beaten eggs
2 cups milk
1/3 cup sugar
1/2 tsp cinnamon
1/2 tsp vanilla
3 cups dry bread cubes
1/3 cup raisins

Beat together eggs, milk, sugar, cinnamon and vanilla. Place bread cubes in baking dish. Sprinkle raisins over bread. Pour egg mixture over all. Bake in 325 oven for 35 to 45 minutes or till a knife inserted near the center comes out clean. Cool slightly. Serve warm with lemon sauce or whiskey sauce, if desired. Makes 6 servings.

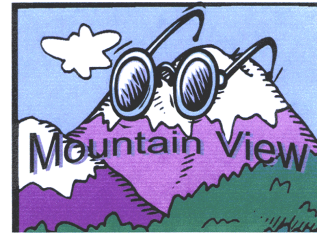
