## Chicken Salad-Stuffed Tomatoes

(Serves 2)

2 Large tomatoes  
2 Tbs. mayonnaise (reduced fat may be used)  
1 Cup finely chopped cooked chicken  
½ Cup fresh corn kernels  
½ Cup snipped chives  
Trimmed watercress  
Salt and pepper to taste



Core tomatoes and scoop flesh into a strainer set over a bowl to catch the juice. Mix together 2 Tbs. of the juice, mayonnaise, chicken, corn and chives and spoon mixture into tomato shells. Serve with watercress tossed with a small amount of the reserved tomato juice; season with salt and pepper.
