Dear Mountain View Residents;

A question I am often asked is do I have to submit a Home Improvement Form and obtain Architectural Review Committee approval to do something like install a patio cover, plant a tree, paint my trim, plant a plant, etc., etc., etc.

The easiest answer is yes, yes, yes. Any time you change anything to the exterior of your house and yard you should submit an application and secure approval. If you are unsure, ask our property manager, a member of the Architectural Review Committee, or a Board member. The ARC guidelines state "Approval from the ARC is required for any additions or alterations to the following:

A. All exterior structures, landscaping, front, side and rear yards; including fences and walls. B. Any change to the exterior appearance of one's property must be approved by the ARC". There is much more in the guidelines which you should read if you are contemplating any change to your yard or outside of your house. These guidelines are available at **www.mountainviewhoa.org** or you can obtain a copy from our property manager. Some things to keep in mind when planning a project, pictures are worth a thousand words. Include them whenever possible. Please make your drawings as detailed as possible. The ARC only meets once per month. You will not receive approval until they have met and you receive an approval letter. This could take from 30 to 45 days, so plan ahead.

PLEASE NOTE. There is a street repair and curb painting project scheduled for June 2nd from 7:30 am to 5:30 pm. Please do not park on the streets during that time.

June 2014 The Gardener's Corner

Well we have finally made it to June the first day of summer falls on the 21st of the month. We have had an up and down year so far in climate and weather, but true gardeners love a challenge. So here are few "Helpful Hints" to make it through the long days of summer. It's time to increase watering to our summer schedule. Lawns will need about two inches of water a week in hot interior valleys. Most shrubs will thrive on much less water than we usually give them. Roots go down about two feet by now--so should the water. If we can keep a wellbalanced program, we should be able to make it through this drought.

The "Be Water Wise" web-site suggests water before 7 a.m. which helps to reduce evaporation. Water the garden deeply every week or two, depending on how consistently the hot weather has been. Tomatoes and other large plants in our clay loam soil use about one foot of water in three days of hot, dry weather. Now if we have added lots of top soil, as suggested, we should use far less. If you should get withering of foliage at the end of a hot dry day it can be expected, but if your plant is still withering through to the following morning this indicates the immediate need for deep watering, for the roots and a gentle sprinkling for the foliage. Keep mulching throughout the summer to conserve more water.

Mow High! Raise your mower cutting height to at least 2 to 3 inches; keep your blade sharp. If you have a gardener tell him your wishes. Weekly lawn cutting should be fine. Don't water too late in the evening. We don't want to get the dreadful fungal diseases, such as rust and black spot, that thrive when air temperatures remain between 70 to 90 degrees.

Remember to keep cool if possible, and enjoy our beautiful California weather. Take plenty of time for your own benefit, and let everyone know gardeners know the best dirt! Best wishes from the garden.
