DELINQUENCY STATUS REPORT:

As of April 30, 2019, there is a total \$6,590.62 in delinquent assessments. This value represents an approximate delinquency rate of 1.58%, as compared to the March 31, 2019 delinquency rate of 1.84%.

COMMITTEE AND MANAGEMENT UPDATES:

Finance: A CD due in June is part a CD ladder which gets about 2.5% return. Board approved Nan Wong as new member of finance committee to replace Duke Yore. We thank Duke for his years of service.

Social: Discovery Luncheon and Fashion Show netted \$700 for Am. Cancer Society. Independence Day Party June 30 with live music. Quilts by Jo Lippire will be raffled for charity. No TGIF in June.

Architectural (ARC): Paint sample books for new house colors have arrived. Most Notices of Completion have been submitted.

Facilities: (See Gym Equipment item, on agenda.) Gym towel dispenser and coat Rack will be relocated. Tennis court benches were repainted. Board approved getting new LED light fixtures for the Mt View sign. Supply shelves were added to pool closet. Rail covers will be replaced at spa. A discoloration on the spa floor will be examined. More outdoor cameras will be considered.

Landscape: Board approved Darlena Stevens as new member of Landscape committee. Some pine trees were removed in the former putting green area. Plant replacement near gates and pool, where needed, is nearly done.

Communications: Newsletter revenue exceeds cost by \$1981 for this fiscal year (August/18-July/19). Excess will be requested for Social Club in August. In-house printing continues to save us money.

Clubhouse Renovation: New upholstered chairs, microwave, side tables, counter bar stools, and library chair have arrived. New window treatments will be installed in June. The 28 new multifunction chairs are expected in late June. Morel to come.

#### PRETZEL CRUSTED CHICKEN

- 2 Boneless, skinless chicken breast halves
- 2 Tbs honey mustard
- 4 Thin slices deli ham
- 1 ½ Tsp butter, melted
- 1/4 Cup crushed pretzels
  - Cut a horizontal slit on one side of each chicken breast to about ½ inch of the opposite side.
  - Spread honey mustard inside each pocket.
  - Stuff with 2 ham slices.
  - Place in a baking dish coated with nonstick cooking spray.
  - Brush each with butter and sprinkle with pretzels.

Bake, uncovered at 350 for 40-45 minutes or until juices run clear.

Hello Mountainview gardeners,

This month we need to begin watering our gardens regularly. Trees require a soaking once a month. We want to encourage tree roots to grow deep and light watering encourages shallow surface rooting. Well maintained trees help keep our community beautiful and healthy.

June is not a good month to add new plants. You can do so but water diligently. Doing so will allow them to establish deep roots in order to survive a day or two without irrigation. Do not feed any newly planted trees or shrubs! However, established plants like Jacaranda trees, Bottlebush trees, Southern Magnolias, Hibiscus, Lantana, Bougainvillea and Mandevilla should be lightly fed according to package directions.

Feed Azaleas, Camellias and Gardenias with a fertilizer specifically for plants that prefer acidic soil. This will lower the PH beneath the plants to an acceptable range. It may be necessary to re-apply each month of the growing season.

Iron deficiency chlorosis is common in plants. You may see yellow leaves with dark green veins. Most often seen on Gardenias, it can also be found on other plants. Growth can be stunted and blooms poor. Apply an iron supplement like "Ironite" to the soil under the dripline. Avoid spilling iron pellets as they stain sidewalks and driveways when wet.

Hibiscus plants require a high potassium, low nitrogen fertilizer. Tomato fertilizer with a high percentage of potassium is ideal.

As a general rule, if a plant is growing fast and blooming heavily, it should be fed two or three times during its active growing season in order to replace what it removes from the soil.

Did you know that Queen Palms are accurate barometers of healthy soil? If the leaves are yellow or growth is stunted use palm tree fertilizer spikes as directed. They will feed for an entire year. Spikes are also available for Citrus trees and shrubs. Please note: trees and shrubs may still require supplemental iron even if using tree spikes. Spikes are also available for shrubs. You can fertilize and add supplemental iron at the same time.

It's time to raise the height of your lawn mower to allow the grass to grow slightly taller. This shades the vulnerable root zone and prevents scalding. Be sure to check your sprinklers for adequate coverage.

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
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
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
