Annual elections for the Mountain View Community Association were held on February 20, 2008. Your new Board and officers for 2008 are: George Podolsky, President; Don MacIsaac, Vice-President; Sue Janssen, Secretary; Fred Humphrey, Treasurer; and Jim McCaffery, director-at-large. Please give them your support in the coming year.

We have 255 homes in Mountain View. Only 114 homeowners voted for the Board members. If we want to continue to make Mountain View a "great place to live," we need homeowners to vote for board members who will pursue their interests. Two board positions will be up for election next January, 2009. Take the time to vote

The Board approved the installation of an automatic external defibrillator (AED) for the Clubhouse, exercise room, pool area. State Law requires that we have personnel trained to operate the AED. We need volunteers from the community to do this. If you are interested, please call our property manager, Jacqueline Bill. This is a chance to learn CPR and the AED and have your training paid for by Mountain View. The life you save might be a loved one or a friend

Architectural Review The Committee Design Guidelines were


Rancho Belago Crime Prevention Committee Meeting Report for February 13, 2008 By George Podolsky

A meeting was held at the Moreno Valley Ranch clubhouse on February 13, 2008. The following items were discussed:

- 1. Moreno Valley Burglary Suppression Team presented a report on how they have lowered burglaries and what we can help them.
 - A. If approached in a shopping center parking lot and asked if you want to buy a high priced item for a very low price, take down the license number of the vehicle or walk away and call 951-684-0911 to report what happened, give a description of the person, and if the person is still there.
 - B. If you know that a house is vacant, but you see someone that shouldn't be there, call the number above to report it.
 - C. Burglaries are down by 40%.
- 2. The next Crime Prevention Committee meeting will be held on Wednesday, April 9, 2008 at 7:00 p.m. and is open to all home owners in Rancho Belago. It will be held at the Moreno Valley Ranch Community Association, 16010 Rancho Del Lago, Moreno Valley. Please plan to attend.

THE GARDENER'S CORNER

• From the gardener's corner...The warm weather in February was a gift and it allowed us to get a good start on garden cleanup. Spring! It begins March 21st and not soon enough for most of us. If you are planning to add a citrus or avocado this year, do so later this month through May, as the weather warms up. Choose a southwest exposure that is protected from the wind. Watch out for snails as they love citrus. Feed the whole garden now with an all-purpose 15-15-15 as everything is starting to grow.

Arbor Day is celebrated in California on March 7th in honor of horticulturist Luther Burbank's birthday. Burbank is famous for his work improving varieties of flowers (Shasta Daisies), fruits (Santa Rosa Plums), grains, grasses, vegetables and trees. Trees are especially important as nature's filtering system. Each day we each use 58 pounds of oxygen all coming from plants and trees. They literally filter the air by collecting dust and pollutants before they reach our lungs. Plant a tree!

Rub off new unwanted foliage on roses, especially when it points in toward the center of the bush. When the growth is young, this pruning is easy - just a flick of a fingernail will do it.


We hope everyone remembers the brunch at the California Baptist University in Riverside early this month (March 2). The management really knows how to put out a great fare.

What's Cooking? (from Katie's Kitchen Corner)

IRISH SODA BREAD

(Makes 1 loaf)

3 cups flour

1 TBS baking powder

1/3 cup sugar

1 tsp salt

1 tsp baking soda

1 egg, lightly beaten

2 cups buttermilk

½ cup butter, melted

1 cup raisins, optional

Preheat oven to 350°. Grease a 9x5 inch pan. Combine flour, baking powder, sugar, salt and baking soda. Blend egg and buttermilk and add all at once to the flour mixture. Mix until just moistened. Stir in butter. Fold in raisins.

Bake for 65-70 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted in the bread comes out clean. Cool on a wire rack. Wrap in foil for several hours, or overnight, for best flavor.
