Lighted House Numbers and Climbing Plants

At meeting I attended recently, I had the opportunity to talk to the captain of the fire department that serves our community. He stated that during a recent emergency call to our community he observed that some homes have lighted house number signs with burnt out light bulbs. He also noted several homes that either have climbing or tall plants that are covering the lighted house number signs.

His concern is that, in case of an emergency, the fire department or paramedics could miss the house due to these conditions. He requested that the climbing and tall plants be trimmed so that the lighted house number signs can be seen from whichever direction the emergency vehicle is traveling.

While on this subject, I want to remind everyone that we do live in an area where rodents are present, and that climbing plants or shrubbery provide a nesting place for these pests. The climbing plants or shrubbery that are growing across your roof can allow these pests access to your attic. Again, by trimming the plants so that they are below the roof line, you can eliminate this problem.


Moreno Valley Crime Prevention Committee Meeting Report By George Podolsky

Sergeant Rico addressed the matter of Off Road Vehicles and how they are destroying the natural landscape of different parts of Moreno Valley. He explained the existing laws governing the police department and how ineffective they are. Sergeant Rico explained a proposed law for Moreno Valley backed by the police and how it would impact the illegal Off Road Vehicles.

THE GARDENER'S CORNER

• From the gardener's corner...May, what a wonderful month in the garden! Plant the heat-lovers, the vegetables and flowers that seem to thrive and bloom when the weather is hot and sunny. Keep an eye out for fruit tree and rose suckers or water sprouts. They don't flower and they compete for water and nutrients. They grow from the base of the plants or trees. Yank them out or roughly smash or cut them to discourage re-growth. For your lawns, now is the time to apply a weed and feed application. You can remove faded blooms and seed pods from spring blooming bulbs but leave the foliage until it dies back naturally. Maintain a good mulch of organic matter covering garden soil throughout the summer. This prevents crusting and cracking of the soil surface, holds in moisture, encourages earthworms, and moderates soil temperature for optimum root growth.

Continue feeding and watering your roses, shrubs and trees. Deadhead those withering roses down to the next lower five-part leaf, and new growth and buds will appear. Rose problems may appear this month. Aphids? Put your hand behind the leaves and spray full force with your hose. Make sure to cover the undersides of the leaves where the aphids reside. Everyone hates powdery mildew. Be sure to water very early in the morning so no moisture clings to the plant later in the afternoon. I just read of a (new to me) solution. Control mildew by spraying foliage with the following formula: 1 tablespoon baking soda plus 1 tablespoon dormant oil to 1 gallon of water.

Keep up the good work and happy digging in the dirt!




WOMEN'S BIBLE STUDY

CRAB MELTS

(Serves 2)

- 1 can (6 ounces) crabmeat, drained, flaked and cartilage removed
- 3 TBS mayonnaise
- 5 tsp minced celery
- 1 TBS minced green onion
- 2 English muffins, split
- 4 slices tomato
- 4 slices cheddar cheese (1/2 oz. each)
- 4 slices Monterey Jack cheese (1/2 oz. each)
- Paprika


In a small bowl, combine crab, mayonnaise, celery and onion. Place the muffins on an ungreased baking sheet. Broil 4-6 inches from the heat until toasted. Spread each muffin half with the crab mixture. Top with the tomato and cheese; sprinkle with paprika. Broil until bubbly.
