

Pie

Crust:

- 1 cup chocolate cookie crumbs(20 cookies)
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup sugar
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup butter

Combine ingredients; press into a pie plate.

Bake at 375 for 10 mins. Cool.

Filling:

- 1 pkg. cream cheese, softened (8 Oz.)
- 1 cup creamy peanut butter
- $\frac{3}{4}$ cup sugar
- 1 Tbsp. butter
- 1 tsp. vanilla

Beat until smooth.

Whip and fold into mixture.

DID YOU KNOW? MAY 2012

This month I'd like to talk about the ARC and what we are doing in this committee.

By late April, you should have

received a letter from Merit Co., our community manager, with a new set of submittal procedures and new home improvement forms. Over the years, as our mission has changed, our forms have changed.

The ARC mission, through the first years of our development, was to maintain the guidelines set up for our new homes, including installation of backyards, and maintaining front yards that were installed when we moved into Mountain View, and the slump-stone walls and landscape additions we wished to make. Now that we have been through these things, and our community is a decade old, our mission has evolved. Our new, evolved, mission is to ensure that Mountain View remains as nice and as well maintained as it has been through our first 10 years. Now, instead of installing our back yards and patios, patio covers and out drains, we are replacing trees that didn't quite make it, repainting the house that has endured 10 years of desert sun, and changing landscaping themes or ideas.

Repainting our home is probably the most important project we will encounter over the next several years. While our CC&R's tell us we may re-paint our homes and/or our fences using the same colors (see Mfg. #) and color scheme (see Ryland plans) our homes had originally, without ARC notification, this leaves the ARC and the board with a verification and record keeping problem. Without ARC input homeowners, contractors, ARC, nor the board can be sure we have selected, and are re-painting with the correct colors and/or materials. This is a problem we've been working to solve.

Therefore, we are asking for your patience and cooperation. Please, before repainting or re-staining, check with ARC. ARC has the ability to verify by home address, and provide you with, based on model and elevation, all proper and current Mfg. color numbers for stucco and trim, roof tiles and on some models, stone, plus approved paint and stain colors for wood fencing originally used on our homes.


Merit Co., our property manager, has suggested we photograph each home in the community and attach pertinent color and material information to insure that the ARC, and management, can provide you, or the next owner, with the necessary, and correct, information.

I will work with the board to get this project approved. This will ensure both homeowner and contractor have the best information available.

Please read through the submittal procedures and look through the home improvement forms. Submit to management, or ARC, any suggestions or questions you may have on this subject.


