On-going Projects:


• Board asked management to obtain three (3) proposals for staining the clubhouse entrance, atrium and the patio area outside of the pool. This will include the fireplace patio.

GARDENER'S CORNER

HAPPY THANKSGIVING!

November marks the beginning of the rainy season if we are fortunate. We can't count on it, so let us be as water wise as possible. We can start by checking our sprinkler systems for leaks, over spray and by replacing our sprinkler heads. Also, check time on sprinkler controls. Did you know that following these few steps we could save up to 500 gallons a year?

Now is the time to put your mulch around plants to reduce evaporation. If you need more information, check www.bewaterwise.com. Continue planting cool season flowers such as mums and beautiful wildflowers from seeds.

For sunny areas, let's plant ground covers such as gazania, lantanas, and geraniums. If you have a hill, try ice plants. For your shady areas, plant needlepoint ivy, star jasmine and asparagus fern. Plant bulbs that have been chilling in storage. Also over seed Bermuda grass with winter rye grass.

Don't feed roses at this time of year they will bloom without being fed. As for your dormant fruit trees spraying should be scheduled around Thanksgiving, but save time for your friends and relatives for mostly your well-deserved meal.
