As a board member, I hear complaints but very seldom solutions. By becoming a board member, you have the chance to find out what is happening with our governance and have a positive influence on our community.

If not on the board, what about volunteering as a committee member? We have the Facilities/Landscape Committee

which is responsible for all the common area properties such as the clubhouse, pool and spa, and common area landscaping. The Architectural Review Committee is responsible for all additions and changes to individual homes such as landscaping, fence color, etc. The Social Club has many activities and is always looking for volunteers. We also have our own web page and a committee who works on that. Make a difference. Volunteer.

We recently had a situation where the pool became cloudy and needed chlorine. The problem occurred because of the transition to the new pool maintenance company. Fortunately, we have some great volunteers who fixed the problem within the day. During that period we received an e-mail from a homeowner who threatened to call the health department and have the pool closed unless the Board did something immediately. The point I am trying to make is that I am seeing an attitude of "the homeowners against the Board and HOA." The Board and HOA are *you, the homeowners*. If you don't like the direction the community is going, then run for the Board, volunteer for a committee that guides the HOA, and also attend the monthly HOA meetings and make your concerns known.

**MEETING HIGHLIGHTS—SEPTEMBER 20, 2006**

**BOARD ACTION**

- Jacqueline Bill introduced Administrative Assistant, Paula Scrimsher.
- Approved minutes of previous meeting.
- Approved Financials for August 2006. Total operating assets \$48,001.65. Total reserves are \$397,733.08. Total assets are \$445,734.73.
- Approved collection on delinquent accounts
- Approved replacement of stolen plants at the Cactus entrance at a cost of \$617.50, and damaged plants near the spa for \$108.00.
- Received a report from Jacqueline Bill that Pro Tech Buildings Services would begin their maintenance work on September 22, 2006. The first repairs will include striping the parking lot and painting the curbs.
- Reported that the vote regarding a change of the CC&R's related to parking has been changed to accommodate the schedule of the Inspector of Voting. The new date will be November 8, 2006. Homeowners may vote by mailing their ballot as directed in the information sent to each home. Homeowners may elect to personally bring their ballot to the clubhouse. The ballots must be placed in the envelopes provided for mailing or for personal delivery.
- Was advised by the chairman that a mailing would be sent to each homeowner regarding a policy change for the Enforcement of Rules.

**COMMITTEE REPORTS**

- **Facilities:** Reported that the pest control vendor has made an inspection of the attic and reported there is no evidence of current rodent infestation. The treadmill has been repaired. The Board approved a motion to replace the pedals on the bicycles, at a cost not to exceed \$100. The Board Chairman reported that the storage shed item is to be continued since the Board has not received a consensus regarding this item. They will continue to evaluate options.
- **Design Review:** Chairman Sais reminded homeowners that they have six months to complete projects that have been approved and that they should request a notice of completion by contacting Prescott.
- **Landscape:** Jacqueline Bill provided information regarding trimming of Acacia trees on the slopes. The trees will be trimmed in the regular fall maintenance cycle. The Board acknowledged resignations from members of the Landscape Committee. The Board approved a motion to combine the Landscape and Facilities Committees.
- **Social Committee:** Invited everyone to join the fun in October. Judy Neuberger, an early mayor and longtime resident of Moreno Valley, will speak on October 3 about the history and development of the City. The Halloween Party will be held on Friday, October 13. See the Social Page of the newsletter for details.
- **Webpage:** It was reported that links are continuing to be added and everyone is encouraged to check out the webpage.

**OPEN FORUM**

There was a report from homeowners that the lighting around the Clubhouse and parking area was not working properly. There were questions regarding the costs associated with the proposed CC&R's vote to change parking rules and the costs for enforcing rules, specifically, parking.

## THE GARDENER'S CORNER

*From the gardener's corner*...gardening is a pleasure this month.

Things are growing slower and the pleasantly cool weather is refreshing to work in after the summer's heat. **Harvest herbs** now for making wreaths or vinegars as holiday presents. If you are lucky enough to have a fresh pumpkin, **toast - don't toss those pumpkin seeds**. Wash the seeds well and separate them from the stringy pulp. Spread them on a cookie sheet and toast them for 3 or 4 minutes at 375 degrees. Stir and toast them another 2 or 3 minutes until they are evenly golden. **Feed citrus and avocados** with a high level of phosphorus and potassium but no nitrogen to toughen them up for winter. Keep them watered until the rains take over.

**Discontinue feeding deciduous trees** now to make them cold hardy. Plan your dormant fruit tree spraying schedule to coincide with cool weather holidays – Thanksgiving, New Year's Day and Valentine's Day. Spraying at the precise period of bud swell is important – before the bud swell is too early and after the blossoms open is too late. **Separate and replant crowded clumps of bulbs**. Many will grow well beneath deciduous trees as most of the bulb growth is in the early spring before the trees leaf out.

**You can still seed thin spots in your established lawn**. After a month of sowing, that area will be ready for mowing. Remember to change your irrigation schedule. Cooler weather slows evaporation and transpiration from plant foliage, so less water is needed. (*TIP from Water District*: If you water every day, cut back just one day a week. You will not notice any

I know meatloaf is meatloaf, but this is easy, good, and serves two nicely with great leftovers for one.

## Meat Loaf for Two

½ pound lean ground beef  
1 egg  
2 TBS bread crumbs  
1 TBS milk (I use 2%)  
Sprinkle of onion salt and pepper to taste

If desired, add any of the following:

Chopped green pepper

Grated cheese

Chopped onion vs. onion salt

Some canned mushrooms, drained (use the amount you wish)

Sauce:

¼ cup ketchup

2 TBS brown sugar

¼ tsp Worcestershire sauce

Mix together ingredients for meatloaf. Shape into a loaf and place in a shallow baking dish coated with no stick cooking spray. Mix together sauce and spoon over meatloaf. Bake at 350° oven for 40–45 minutes or until meat is no longer pink.

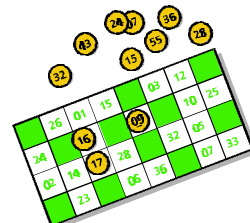
