Letters from Property Management

When a homeowner receives a violation letter from our Property Manager, the violation was either called in by a homeowner(s) who reported an infraction of the CC&R's / Rules and Regulations or the ARC Guidelines on your property **or** the Property Manager observed this violation during the monthly inspection of our community.

The Property Manager's letter to the homeowner will explain the violation.

The homeowner **must respond** to this violation letter to the Property Manager.

- 1. They must explain what methods will be used to remedy this violation.
- 2. Explain why the letter is in error.

To reply to the Property Manager, the phone number and email address are listed on the front page of our Newsletter.

If there is not a reply, the homeowner will receive a second letter requesting a response from the Property Manager. A letter to appear before the Board will be mailed to the owner if there is not a reply to the second letter. If the owner refuses to appear before the Board, most likely the homeowner will receive a money Fine of a certain amount included within the monthly HOA statement.



If the reported violation continues to go uncorrected, inform the management company by phone, e-mail or letter.

Watering Our Lawns

On September 1, 2008 Eastern Municipal Water District (EWND):

Stop Water Runoff Program and Penalties ARE NOW in Effect!

What does this mean for our community? As you are aware a few months ago EWMD issued an alert about our water, telling us that we should **not water our lawns before Dusk or after Dawn.** Many of us are stilling watering our lawns during the day when the sun is the hottest. The hours from 7:00 am to dusk are the worst hours to water, because the suns rays do not allow enough time for the water to soak into the ground.

House Number Fixture and Light Bulbs

Where can I get replacement bulbs? Where can I purchase a new light fixture?

You can purchase replacement light bulbs at ACE Hardware on Sunnymead Blvd., or at Lowes in their Specialty Light Bulb Section. Remember to take the old bulb to the store.

If you cannot find a replacement light bulb locally try contacting either Progressive Lighting or Pacific Builders Hardware at the phone numbers below.

The *light fixture* (the plastic cover, the metal frame holding the light bulbs) was manufactured by Progressive Lighting, and the model number is 101BKA4PBK. "<u>Progressive Lighting</u>" can be reached at 864-678-1010 for the replacement of the plastic cover or the metal frame.

If after replacing the light bulbs and the bulbs do not light up, the transformer needs to be replaced. Lowes, ACE Hardware and Home Depot carry the transformers. If you do not know how to replace the transformer, call an electrician.

Garage Door Opener

What is the model number? Where can I get a new one?

LiftMaster 972LM is the model number of the unit that will open the entry access gates and your garage door.







THE GARDENER'S CORNER

• From the gardener's corner...Before we get into October's garden care, I have a new development to help curb the citrus mite that is plaguing our lemon, lime and orange trees. The manufacturer is ISCA Technologies, phone number 686-5008 in Riverside, the item Iscalure citrella. It is a pheromone lure and a hard paper trap. Please call them for ordering information.

Gardening is a pleasure this month. Things are growing slower and pleasantly cool weather is refreshing to work in after the summer's heat. **Feed citrus and avocados** with a high level of phosphorus and potassium but no nitrogen to harden them up for winter. Keep them watered until the rains take over. Discontinue feeding deciduous trees now to make them cold hardy. Don't forget to plant your dormant fruit trees to coincide with cool weather holidays, Thanksgiving , New Year's Day and Valentine's Day. Spraying at the precise moment of bud swell is important - before the bud swell is too early and after the blossoms open is too. Late. If you haven't shopped **the Semi annual Plant Sale at the UCR Botanical Gardens** this is a good time to go for the fall sale. October18th from Noon to three pm and October 19th from 9 am to Noon. Get there Saturday by noon for the best selection. Happy digging in the dirt!

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Moreno Valley District 3 Crime Prevention Committee Report

I want to thank all of you from our community who took the time to attend this months meeting.

Next months meeting will be on Wednesday, October 8, 2008 at 7:00 pm and will be held at the Moreno Valley Club House, 16010 Rancho Del Lago, Moreno Valley, CA 92551. Please plan on attending.

Diane Rodriguez from Riverside County's Economic Development Agency did a presentation on Section 8 housing.

Office F. Lefever from the Moreno Valley Police Department Community Services POP team gave a presentation on how to make our homes CRIME FREE. Here is a list of tips she gave:

Locks - 1 inch dead bolt on all entry doors

Shrubbery – Should be no taller then the bottom of any windows. Trim all shrubbery at least 1 foot from the bottom. This will not give burglars a place to hide.

Windows/Screens – Windows/ Sliding glass doors secured with an independent locking system. Screens on all Windows/Sliding glass doors. By placing a screw at the top of all window screens you will prevent the screen from being lifted up and out.

Peep Holes – All peep holes should have a 180 degree viewing area. This will not only allow you to see who is in front, but if someone is standing to the right or left of the door.

Strike Plates & Screws – All entry strike plates should have screws that are 2 to 3 inches in length. This will help prevent the door from opening when someone kicks it.

Officer Karl Smith from the Moreno Valley Police Department Community Services Neighborhood Watch gave a presentation on crime prevention tips. Here is a list he gave:

CRIME PREVENTION TIPS

*Leave some drapes and shades open. Closed drapes and shades indicate an unoccupied house. *Have your lawn taken care of. Dry uncut grass says that you're away. Keep shrubs and plants trimmed. Tall shrubbery can hide windows/doors which give a thief a place to work unseen.

*Put peepholes in front doors. Those with magnifying glass lens are best. You can see whose outside without opening the door. Consider door chains too. *Never* leave a note on your door saying that you are not home.

*Take care with your keys. Don't leave a key under a doormat, flowerpot or on a ledge. Burglars look in these locations first. Never leave an ignition key in your car and never put a house key on your ignition key ring.

*Ask your local police to check your home periodically when you will be gone for an extended period. Also, talk to them about Neighborhood Watch Programs.

*Leave a radio on. Turn it to a talk radio station, if possible, and turn the volume loud enough to be heard outside. This indicates that someone is home. Turn you phone ringer or bell down so that a prowler can't hear the phone ringing.

*Don't keep expensive jewelry at home, unless you have a secure safe. All valuables and important documents should be kept in a safe or a safe deposit box.

*Mark valuable items with your California Drivers License number. Televisions, stereos, VCR's are items a thief is likely to steal. Keep a list of these items, along with their serial number, in a safe place.

*Secure patio doors. A steel or wooden rod in the guide channel will work. A pin type lock may also be used for added security.

*Keep your garage door down and locked. This helps protect property stored inside. While you are away, electric doors should be disconnected and padlocked.

*Look into an alarm system. There are hundreds of different systems on the market. Costs are commensurate with the sophistication.

*Make an inventory of items in your home. Take photos of valuable items. Keep one copy for yourself and give the other to your insurance company. Or you can make a Videotape (Camcorder) entire home and all rooms containing your property and valuables.

The California Department of Insurance has a book you can get for free that will assist with the inventory. The book is titled "Home Inventory Guide". It can be obtained by calling 800-927-4357 or by going to <u>www.insurance.ca.gov</u>.

The next speaker was Al Brady who is the Manager for the City of Moreno Valley's Code Enforcement Department. Mr. Brady told us that the Moreno Valley City Counsel has instructed his department to enforce the codes requiring all home owners to maintain their house while selling. This now gives Merit a new tool to use when we have a house in foreclosure and the property is not being maintained.
