Last night's HOA meeting was interesting and informative. You should try to attend at least one to find out what your Board is doing and how it affects you. Last night a representative from Artistic Maintenance gave a presentation on California Friendly landscaping.

The Chairperson of the Landscaping committee reported that someone is stealing our plants at both the Cactus and JFK gates. My take on this is that some landscaper sees us as a nursery. We plant new plants and he takes them to plant on his client's property. Please keeps a lookout for someone doing this. Our landscapers, Artistic Maintenance, all wear florescent vests and have a truck with the door panel sign saying Artistic Maintenance.

If you see someone else working on our landscaping please let the property manager know ASAP. Also a picture with a cell phone would be very helpful.

Chuck Hedger, Chairperson of the Architectural Review Committee reported that some homeowners are performing major projects without submitting the proper paperwork and obtaining approval. When you are doing most projects around your house you must submit an Architectural Review Committee (ARC) Home Improvement Form and have it approved before starting on the project. If you do not do this you will be subject to a hearing before the Board and a fine. Yes, projects such as walkway improvements, solar panels, planting trees, installing a security door, etc., all require approval. Please read the ARC guidelines before you do a project and obtain approval when necessary.

One other thing of note. The Board voted not to heat the pool for December. This means the pool will not be heated from December thru March 2015. It will still be open for use, just not heated. The Spa remains heated all year.
